Dear AIA-LA Society Members,

The board and I sincerely hope that this email finds you well amidst the many uncertainties facing our communities these days. One of the challenges we as a Society face at this time is offering programming that furthers the mission of the AIA, while being sensitive to the many concerns and difficulties that our membership and their families are facing. We hope that the AIA-LA can be a place for respite from day-to-day concerns and allow you and the public at large to continue to pursue your intellectual interests in archaeology. In this fall's newsletter I would like to report on the **annual membership vote** from earlier this summer, encourage you to **renew your membership** and support our mission, let you know about **upcoming awards and fellowships** to apply for, announce changes to **our website**, and mention our **programming for the coming year**.

Membership vote. Based on membership voting completed August 1, we can report that the revised bylaws, as attached, have been approved (see table on last page for full list of board members). Furthermore, all board nominations for service for the terms indicated below, have also been approved; this was contingent upon approval of the bylaws, which have made 3-year terms standard (rather than 1-year, as was the case when we inaugurated the revised bylaws two years ago).
